
Identifying the 50c Surcharges

All surcharged with 50 in roman numerals and Chinese 改作五角 gǎi zuò wǔ jiǎo (zuò is also spelt kuo or tso in earlier transliterations as in Chan & Ma), 'changed to 50 cents'.

Honan issued both black and red surcharges, but otherwise the surcharges were the same for both.

According to Ma, vertical spacings are measured between 改 and 作 - gai & zuo. See diagram on right.
